

Types of child care arrangements that are eligible for subsidy:

- Licensed child care settings – Group or Family
- Registered Licence-Not-Required child care settings (through CCRR's)
- Licence-Not-Required child care settings
- In the Child's Own Home settings

Licensed child care settings include:

- Group centres
- Family child care providers
- Out of school facilities
- Preschool

Registered licence-not-required:

Child care is provided in the home of the care provider and **is not** licensed under the *Community Care and Assisted Living Act* and **is** registered in a Child Care Resource and Referral Program (CCRR).

Registered Licence-Not-Required care providers can only care for up to **two** children or one sibling group (of two or more children) other than the care provider's own children.

Licence-not-required:

Child care is provided in the home of the care provider and **is not** licensed under the *Community Care and Assisted Living Act* and **is not** registered with a Child Care Resource and Referral Program (CCRR).

Licence-Not-Required child care providers may only care for up to **two** children or one sibling group (of two or more children) other than the care provider's own children.

In the Child's Own Home:

Child care is provided in the child's own home by someone other than a relative or dependant of the parent who resides in the child's home. A relative may provide In the Child's Own Home care if they **do not reside** in the child's home.
